PUBLIC NOTICE

Public Notice of Final Action for the Addition of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Services

The South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (SCDHHS) gives notice of the following actions regarding the addition of covered codes for ASD services under the State Plan under Title XIX of the Social Security Act Medical Assistance Program (Medicaid).

SCDHHS will add the following new ASD procedure codes effective for dates of service on or after July 1, 2024:

97152	Behavior Identification Supporting Assessment	Behavior identification supporting assessment, administered by one technician under the direction of a physician or other qualified health care professional, face-to-face with the patient, each 15 minutes.	Registered Behavior Therapist (RBT)	\$20.50 21 units/day
97157	Multi-Family Group Adaptive Behavior Treatment Guidance	Multiple-family group adaptive behavior treatment guidance, administered by physician or other qualified health care professional (without the patient present), face-to-face with multiple sets of guardians/caregivers, each 15 minutes	Board- certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA)	\$13.31 16 units/day
0362T	Behavior Identification Supporting Assessment, 2 or more Technicians	 Behavior identification supporting assessment, each 15 minutes of technicians' time face-to-face with a patient, requiring the following components: administered by the physician or other qualified health care professional who is on site, with the assistance of two or more technicians, for a patient who exhibits destructive behavior, completed in an environment that is customized to the patient's behavior. 	BCBA, Board- certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA), RBT	\$27.95 16 units/day (based on time elapsed, not total time per each technician)
0373T	Adaptive Behavior Treatment, 2 or more Technicians	Adaptive behavior treatment with protocol modification, each 15 minutes of technicians' time face-to-face with a patient, requiring the following components: • administered by the physician or other qualified health care professional who is on site, • with the assistance of two or more technicians, • for a patient who exhibits destructive behavior, • completed in an environment that is customized to the patient's behavior.	BCBA, BaCBA, RBT	\$30 32 units/day (based on time elapsed, not total time per each technician)

SCDHHS is making these changes to support access to behavioral health services, enhance the state's provider network, and ensure services are delivered effectively.

Based on the actions above, SCDHHS projects a budget impact of approximately \$1.4 million (total dollars) per year.
