- Less alcohol, fewer opioids
- Fentanyl remains an unexpected overdose threat.





Dependence vs Use

- No amount of use is risk-free
- Identifying factors for use that appears disordered
- Determining the need for diagnosis and clinical intervention

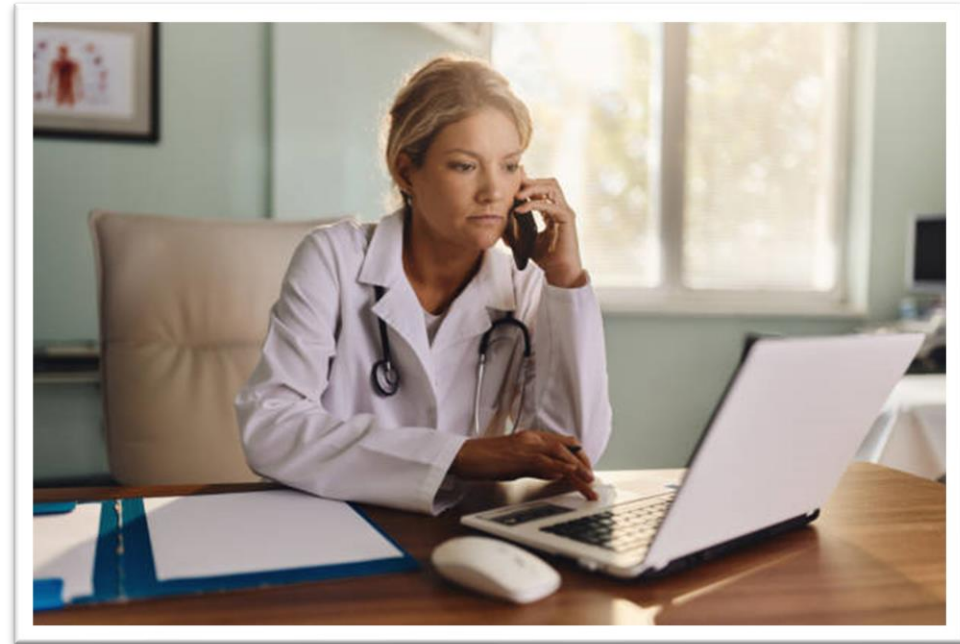
Positive Screen, Now What?

SC's publicly funded treatment system – Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disability (DBHDD)

- **Adolescent treatment coordinators throughout the state**
 - 31 local authorities
- **Office of Substance Use Services Office of Mental Health Services: William S. Hall Psychiatric Institute/ Child & Adolescent; 803-898-1662**
 - 37-bed residential treatment facility for children and adolescents includes 18-bed dual-diagnosis inpatient unit for adolescents with SUD
- **Office of Substance Use Services: William J. McCord Adolescent Treatment Facility; 803-534-2328**
 - 15-bed inpatient facility
 - Medical care and medical withdrawal services (“detox”)
 - Psychiatric evals
 - Counseling
 - Discharge planning
