Comment: The YTY report was flagged for exceeding the threshold for Section A - Birth through 2 Total by Other Setting. Early in FFY 2023, South Carolina Part C implemented a flexible model of service coordination, allowing service coordination companies to choose to provide service coordination as a stand-alone, dedicated service, or blended with special instruction. Up to this point, the state had always provided Service Coordination in a blended model. This flexibility was introduced as a mechanism to address lingering issues with provider shortages that began during the COVID-19 public health emergency. Until the pandemic, South Carolina had never experienced a provider shortage for service coordination and special instruction. In FFY 2022, the state's data system report for Primary Service settings was revised to exclude children who do not have active services on their current IFSP, those who have aged out of the program but have not yet closed in the system, and those who have planned services that only include services/codes that are not required to be provided in the natural environment (e.g. evaluations, interpreting, service coordination, etc.).
