Make It A Conversation (MIAC) is a youth engagement program that engages Kershaw County youth in a variety of educational, recreational, and community engagement activities, events and programs. Youth leadership development is achieved by involving youth in every aspect of the community. The youth develop communication strategies, engage with law enforcement, host lunches that create conversations with community leaders and expose them emerging youth leaders. Brian and Roberta Mays have long been active in the lives of those who in some cases would be called "at-risk" and engaging and exposing these youth to opportunities to learn, grow and develop leadership skills. The track record of the improved academic achievement of youth in these programs is documented and endorsed by the KC School District and evidenced by improved grades, attendance, and most dramatically in graduation rate and college and military placement! The Kershaw County community is fortunate to have this program and these funds will help expand the scope and reach of the program. The board of directors for MIAC has engaged with the United Way of Kershaw County as fiscal agent and is exploring ways to grow the program in scope and in excellence to help engage more youth in greater ways throughout the county and beyond.

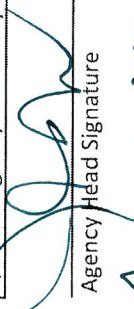
